Schedule W-FL
Private Fire Protection Service
Effective January 2, 2010

(Supersedes Schedule W-FL Effective June 1, 1999)

AVAILABILITY

This rate schedule is available to customers who require fire streams in addition to that which can be supplied by public hydrants for the protection of property on customer's premises, and who have met the following conditions:

1. A private fire system is installed and operated on customer premises in accordance with District's "Rules and Regulations".
2. All fire service openings shall be kept closed and sealed, except in the case of fire; and, no water shall be used from the fire protection system pipes, except to extinguish fires.
3. District employees shall have free access to customer premises, at all reasonable hours, for the purpose of inspecting pipes, valves, and opening and sealing valves on customer's private fire protection system.

RATE

A demand charge will be billed for each private fire system according to the size of the fire line and/or the number of hydrants as follows:

20 inch	\$278.00
Hydrants (per)	\$11.68

** Size of fire line at point of beginning of private fire protection system.*

A separate charge will be made for each connection to a District main of a private fire protection

system.

No commodity charge will be made for water supplied through a private fire protection system for extinguishing fires.

PAYMENT

Monthly bills will be rendered at the above rates and are due and payable within fifteen (15) calendar days of date of bill.

LIABILITY

The District shall not be liable to the owner or any other person with respect to the owner's fire protection system, including any failure due to design, installation, or maintenance thereof. Nor does the District make warranty or guarantee with respect to the adequacy of water pressure or water flows.

ABANDONMENT

When a private fire protection system is out of service, the fire line tap shall be removed from the main at owner's expense. A private fire protection system will be deemed out of service when service has been ordered permanently off and/or payment of demand charges has ceased.
